ACCOUNTING MINOR

- ☐ Fall 1: ACCT 2101 - Principles of Accounting I (Minimum grade of C)
- ☐ Spring 1: ACCT 2102 - Principles of Accounting II (Minimum grade of C)
- ☐ Fall 2: ACCT 3XXX/4XXX (Student's Choice)
- ☐ Spring 2: ACCT 3XXX/4XXX (Student's Choice)
- ☐ Fall 3: ACCT 3XXX/4XXX (Student's Choice)

- To enroll in upper-level business courses, a student must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 and must have completed at least 45 credit hours.
- ACCT 2101 and 2102 are the prerequisites for most accounting classes so it is possible to take more than one ACCT 3XXX or 4XXX during the same semester.

- To enroll in upper-level (3000/4000) business courses, a student must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 and must have completed at least 45 credit hours.
- FINC XXXX courses can be chosen from 3000 or 4000 level.
- Student can take ACCT 2102 and FINC 3511 during the same semester. After completing FINC 3511 with a C or higher, student can take both FINC XXXX courses during the same semester.

- To enroll in upper-level (3000/4000) business courses, a student must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 and must have completed at least 45 credit hours.
- Student can take ACCT 2101 and ECON 2105/2106 during the same semester. Student can also take MGNT 3600 and MKTG 3803 during the same semester. Students cannot take MGNT 4660 Strategic Management as their elective choice for a business minor.
